The PERSPECTIVE series is unique in New Brunswick. Audience members are treated to an intimate evening of dance works-in-progress. You hear directly from choreographers and musicians about the creation process, and are given an opportunity to share your thoughts on each work.

Artists receive valuable and immediate audience feedback. Seeing things from different perspectives helps to further develop the work for the artists.

RAUL is a theatre artist, contemporary dancer and educator born in Seville, Spain. Raul studied theatre at School of Dramatic Arts in Seville (Bachelor's Degree) and has a Major in contemporary dance from SEAD (Salzburg Experimental Academy of Dance).

He has performed as an actor and dancer in numerous companies and projects along Europe (Spain, Austria, UK...). Raul has over 12 years of experience working as a contemporary dance teacher in Danza Mobile, an art centre for people with intellectual disabilities in Seville. He has also developed a collection of workshops for elderly and youth at educational centres. Raul now makes New Brunswick his home and has already made inroads into contemporary dance performance and instruction and performance, with a focus on inclusivity and accessibility.

SYDNEY HALLETT

Sydney (she/her) is an energetic, enthusiastic dance and theatre artist based in Fredericton, NB. She currently works as a musical theatre Choreographer at St. Thomas University and Theatre New Brunswick's Theatre School, as well as working as an independent actor and dancer. She has been working and training with Solo Chicken Productions since 2017, recently acting in their production of Fruit Machine, and is excited to now be a MERGE artist! CHRIS VAN GREEN

Chris Van Green is a Canadian-based dancer who excels in performing, choreographing, and teaching.

He collaborates with peers and aims to inspire the next generation of artists. Chris holds a Bachelor of Fine Arts in Theatre and Dance Performance from Toronto Metropolitan University (TMU). Throughout his studies, he received recognition for his remarkable growth and passion for dance, which ultimately earned him the prestigious Kenny Pearl Award. Since graduating, Chris has had the privilege of collaborating with a diverse range of dancers, choreographers, dance companies. Notable collaborations include Connection Dance Works, David Earle, Hannah Kiel, James Kudelka, Ballet Jorgen, and Fernando Melo.



JULIA CARR

Julia has been a professional dancer since 2005, performing in contemporary and vertical dance works by diverse choreographers. A collaborative creator and improviser, she crafts spontaneous moments with musicians and fellow dancers both on stage and in unique settings. Recently relocating from her birthplace in BC, on the unceded territories of the Coast Salish peoples, to St. John's, NL, Julia has held various leadership roles, including Dancestreams Artistic Director, EDAM General Manager, and Aeriosa Assistant Artistic Director. She is now the Artistic Director of Neighbourhood Dance Works.



SARA COFFIN

Sara is an independent dance artist, dance educator and Co-Artistic Director of Mocean Dance. Sara received the Creative Nova Scotia Established Artist Award in 2018. She holds a MFA in Choreography from Smith College (USA), BFA in Dance from Simon Fraser University and Bachelor of Science in Dalhousie Kinesiology from University. Her choreographic work has been presented in many prominent Canadian dance festivals and in the United States. Coffin's research interests include interdisciplinary collaboration, technology as an extension of the body, contact improvisation, and the poetic junction between vulnerability, resiliency and courage.









ANDREW REED MILLER

Andrew has been principal bass of Symphony NB for over 25 years. Originally from New York, Andrew studied in Ottawa and Toronto and eventually toured with The Canadian Opera Company, the National Arts Centre Orchestra and the Royal Winnipeg Ballet. Andrew has performed experimental and new music at many venues, including Open Ears Festival (Kitchener), New Music Calgary, Sound Symposium (Newfoundland), the Scotia Festival of Music, Ensemble Kore (Montreal) The Music Gallery (Toronto), Western Front (Vancouver), and Tonic (New York).

JOEL MILLER

Joel is a Juno award-winning Jazz saxophonist and arranger who has played at the Montreal Jazz festival and toured with Jazz greats like Brian Blade (Daniel Lanois and Emmylou Harris).

His most recent album, UNSTOPPABLE, is the result of Miller's studies with contemporary composer and professor John Rea and conductor Guillaume Bourgogne, and features an 18-piece orchestra made up of Montreal's most in-demand freelancers in the jazz, classical and Latin music. Joel's compositions, improvisations, albums, and shows continue to be recognized with awards (Juno win 2012, ECMA 2012, 2016, 2021). Most importantly, his music communicates joy, celebration, humour, and curiosity about our amazing planet.

MICHAEL MOHAN

Michael Mohan is a Saint John-based filmmaker and photographer with a BFA from NSCAD and a certificate from NBCCD. He has worked on grantfunded projects across Canada, including the short films "A Ways Away" (2016), "krotoplaxx diary disc 1.1" (2017), "Cicerone" (2022), and the Telefilm-supported feature "Further Than The Eye Can See" (2022). His latest cinematography work, "Gravity Assist" (2024), is an experimental short funded by ArtsNB. With his technical expertise and creative eye, Michael continues to pursue exciting projects in the Canadian arts scene.

MARCIA DYSART

Marcia Dysart is an accomplished dancer, choreographer, collaborator, and educator based in Saint John, New Brunswick. With a deep passion for creation, Marcia actively engages in collaborative projects with musicians, visual artists, filmmakers, and fellow dancers. Her work has garnered recognition from the New Brunswick Arts Board and the Saint John Community Arts Funding Program. Marcia's artistic endeavors have been showcased across Atlantic Canada, including performances at the Imperial Theatre in Saint John, Contact East in Charlottetown, IMPACTfest by Atlantic Ballet Theatre, Saint John Contemporary Dance Festival, and Connection Dance Work's PERSPECTIVE.
